
At the end of each term, it is your (the student's) responsibility to check your grades, academic standing, GPA and advising comments. This information can be found via <u>Student Home</u> through the <u>Academic Progress</u> and <u>Academic</u> <u>Records</u> tile. You should also be aware of how to locate your program chart (through the <u>Student Resources</u> tile).

It's also important that you are aware of Seneca's <u>Grading</u> policy and the <u>Student Progression and Promotion policy</u>.

Review the <u>Important Academic Dates</u> to confirm when the final grades will be available each term.



Academic Progress Tile:

Within the Academic Progress tile on Student Home, you can find information on your academic progress (both a summary and detailed information), your expected graduation term, your academic requirements and your Student Adviser's information. Pay particular attention to your **Academic Requirements**.

The Academic Requirements report details the requirements for your program and includes courses taken (both completed and in progress), the grades achieved, the term taken, and the status (taken or in progress).



Academic Records Tile:

Within the Academic Records tile on Student Home, you can find information on your course history, grades, transcripts, and much more. Pay particular attention to **course history**, **view grades**, **unofficial transcript** and **advising comments**.



<u>Course History</u>: allows you to view all courses taken (both completed and in progress, the grades achieved, the term taken and the status (taken or in progress).

<u>View Grades:</u> allows you to view your courses/grades per term, including your term GPA and cumulative GPA.

<u>View Unofficial Transcript</u>: this is a detailed record of your academic history at Seneca. All course attempts are displayed on the transcript. Your transcript includes all courses taken (both completed and in progress, the grades achieved, the term taken, and GPA information. It also includes your awarded credentials.

<u>Advising Comments:</u> advising comments including information such as program transfer requests/responses, course/program recommendations, instructions for courses with temporary grades (INC, SUP, DEF) and academic standing information.

Important Policies:

Seneca's <u>Grading Policy</u> defines the standards for assigning grades to recognize student achievement in a course and program.

Throughout the term, your tests/assignments are graded on a percentage basis. These add up to an overall percentage in the course. At the end of the term, the course percentage converts to a letter grade on your academic record.

Letter grades affect your Grade Point Average (GPA). Use Seneca's <u>GPA Calculator tool</u> to calculate your GPA.

These grade designations do not affect your GPA.

You may also receive a 'temporary grade.' These are typically based on extenuating and extraordinary circumstances, often accompanied by valid official documentation. Temporary grades are eventually converted to a permanent final grade. Be sure to view your grades and advising comments if you receive any temporary grades.

DEF	Deferred examination privilege granted (refer to section 1.6 of this policy)
INC	Incomplete (refer to section 1.7 of this policy)
IP	In progress
SUP	Supplemental privilege granted (refer to section 1.5 of this policy)

GPA Definition and Calculation:

Term GPA:	The GPA for all graded courses within a single term.
Cumulative GPA:	The GPA for all graded courses regardless of the term or program.
Program GPA:	The GPA of all successfully completed graded courses required for a specific program.
Graduating GPA:	The GPA of all graded courses used toward the credential requirement upon graduation.

Seneca's <u>Student Progression and Promotion Policy</u> outlines the requirements to be met by full-time or parttime students to graduate from an Ontario college credential or honours bachelor's degree program at Seneca. Students are deemed to be in good academic standing upon entry into a program. Academic standing is issued at the end of each term, under one of the following categories:

Academic Standing	Description
Good	Assigned to students who have achieved or exceeded all school and program standards. This includes a term GPA equal to or greater than 2.0 (or 2.5 for degree programs) and having failed no courses in the term.
Satisfactory	Assigned to students who have achieved a term GPA equal to or greater than 2.0 (or 2.5 for degree programs) and having failed two or less courses in the term.
Probationary	Assigned to students who have achieved a term GPA of less than 2.0 (or 2.5 for degree programs) or who have failed three or more courses.
Withdrawn	May be assigned to students who do not achieve satisfactory academic standing for two consecutive terms.

Graduation requirements:

Diploma and certificate programs require a minimum graduating GPA of 2.0. Degree programs require a minimum graduating GPA of 2.5, which includes a minimum GPA of 2.5 in all professional courses and a minimum GPA of 2.0 in English and LSO courses.
