**Important Information:** The paralegal field placement program currently offers two field placement formats: in-person and hybrid. An in-person placement involves the students attending in-person at the licensee's office to complete the work delegated by a licensee. A hybrid placement involves a combination of the students working in- person in the licensee's office and remotely from home to complete work delegated by a licensee.

### COMPLIANCE

I confirm that I understand the conditions and objectives of paralegal field placement and certify that I will adhere to the following terms of placement and work arrangements:

•Each licensee shall host a maximum of two (2) paralegal students at one time (as required by the Law Society of Ontario)

•Read and follow the Law Society's "Creating a Safe Work Environment for Licensing Candidates" document provided in the host package

•Provide students with a minimum of 120 hours (or 240 hours starting from Summer 2025) of work related to an area of law within the paralegal scope of practice (civil litigation, criminal, employment, small claims, provincial offences, administrative law/tribunals, immigration)

•The student must not complete any work/tasks in areas of law that are outside the paralegal scope of practice (family law, wills and estates, real estate, corporate law, and contracts)

•Lunch break is not included as time worked in the accumulation of field placement hours

•Evaluate the student(s)' performance by signing an attendance and evaluation form (provided by the student) upon completion of the placement

•Inform Seneca Polytechnic if your status as a licensee with the LSO or CICC changes during a student's placement with you.

•I understand and agree it is the responsibility and obligation of the field placement host to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety Act and other applicable provincial and federal standards, as amended from time to time.

•I am aware of and abide by the <u>Ontario Human Rights Code</u>, <u>Employment Standards Act</u>, <u>Occupational Health &</u> <u>Safety Act</u>, and <u>Seneca's Discrimination and Harassment Policies and Procedures</u>.

•I understand and agree that confidential information (such as student personal information) shall only be used for legitimate purposes related to the field placement program and shall be protected using appropriate safeguards.

# Appendix A Checklist for Home-Base Positions

These positions are situated in residential properties (typically in houses and increasingly in high-rise condominium apartments).

The following are common questions or issues encountered in these kinds of working arrangements. Please check all of the items, which apply to your organization's workspace.
