EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Held last March 16, 2024, the 5th Annual Seneca Housing Hackathon gathered 1,018 participants from 32 colleges and universities across Ontario, marking a notable increase of 49.3% from the previous year. This year's finale event has the highest attendance to date with around 160 finalists, 72 dedicated volunteer student organizers and 40 guests including students, public officials, entrepreneurs and industry leaders. This highlights the ever-growing passion and excitement for the event among various stakeholders.

Apart from idea generation and solution development, the event also features interactive mentoring sessions from field specialists, enriching keynote speeches from successful entrepreneurs and IT experts, and endless networking opportunities. Moreover, the presence of key government officials adds a layer of significance to the event, emphasizing its alignment with broader societal goals and objectives.

Overall, this year's hackathon garnered overwhelmingly positive feedback from participants, highlighting the valuable opportunities it provided for rapport building, knowledge exchange, and collaborative problem-solving. Spectators praised the inclusive atmosphere and the platform it offered for nurturing innovative ideas from the younger generation to address important issues facing our society today.



THE THEME

The theme this year is a response to the current pressing challenges of Canada's housing crisis. Seneca Housing Hackathon aimed to address spectrum of issues, and explore opportunities within the housing sector by strategically breaking down the overarching problem into manageable "challenge sets" jointly with our sponsors and partner institutions.

THE WINNERS



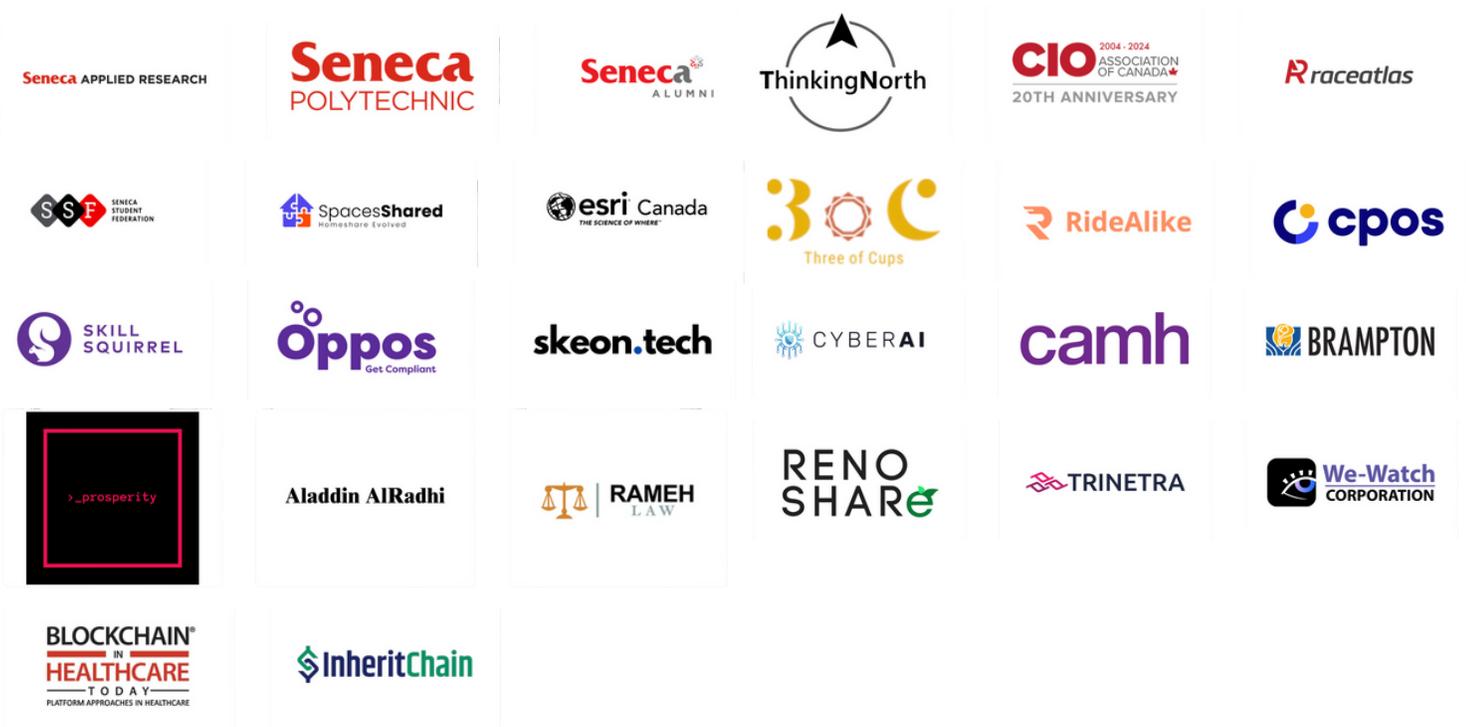
This year, our approach to awards differed slightly from previous years. Rather than having winners within specific categories, we recognized overall winners. This includes 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize recipients, as well as the recipients of the special awards such as Innovation Award, Inclusion Award, and Sustainability Award. The top 4 teams were determined by the judges without ranking them, but the winners were ranked by public vote (Mentimeter), including both participants and guests after the presentation.

- **1st Place:** Team Enigma (in the top photo) won 1st place with their website featuring AI/ML backend analysis that assists students in finding rental homes and gaining market insights. All students are from Seneca Polytechnic.
- **2nd Place:** Students from Seneca Polytechnic, University of Toronto, and Humber College, collectively known as Neighbourhood Cool Cats (bottom right photo), were awarded 2nd place with their gamified apps to support high-density living harmony, including chores and household items.
- **3rd Place:** The 3rd place was awarded to Team Homies (bottom left photo), whose members are students from Seneca Polytechnic, University of Toronto, and Sault College. They developed a rent and lease contract management system and dashboard, including an AI-based chatbot assistant.
- **Special Awards:** Special awards for Innovation and Inclusion were given to Team Signify for their gesture-controlled home assistance system, and the Sustainability Award was given to Team Miraurbana for their e-book and website for housing furniture. Students from both teams are all from Seneca Polytechnic.

Moving Forward

Leveraging Innovations through Strategic Partnerships

- Strengthen industry partnerships to leverage top innovations from the Hackathon.
- Initiate a proactive sales campaign targeting major corporations to secure title sponsorship.
- Utilize resources from Seneca Applied Research and Seneca Works to further develop and integrate promising solutions into practical applications.

Timely Announcement of Theme and Date

- Define the theme and dates for six months prior to the event.
- Engage sponsors early in the process to solicit input and feedback on challenge set definitions.

Exploration of Hybrid Day 1 Finale

- Investigate the feasibility of implementing a hybrid format for Day 1 of the finale to provide deeper mentorship opportunities.

Scaling for Increased Participation

- Scale the overall event for greater numbers by expanding partnerships with schools, organizations, and communities.
