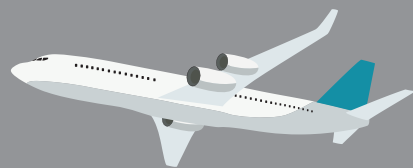

## Section 2 of 2: Arrival

This checklist is specifically for applicants for the Fall (September) 2024 term. It offers tips on what to expect when you arrive in Canada. If you have not already done so, please first review the This way to Seneca — **SECTION 1: PRE-DEPARTURE CHECKLIST** and complete any necessary steps required for your program of study.

### Arrival in Canada

New students starting their studies in September 2024 should make plans to travel to Canada no more than 30 days before the start of class. Returning students may travel earlier.

## International Students Enrolling in the September 2024 Term

To be eligible for a [post-graduation work permit \(PGWP\)](#), you must:

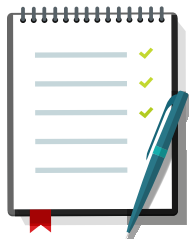
- Complete the duration of your program inside Canada.
- Complete at least 50% of your program in class.
- “In class” includes: in-person, hybrid, and flexible delivery format.
- For flexible delivery you must plan to attend on campus.
- Time spent studying outside Canada after September 1, 2024 will be deducted from the length of your PGWP.

## Arrival Information

### 1) Checklist for travellers to Canada:

- a. Provide your information in the **Seneca MOBILE App**, available for [Apple](#) and [Android](#):
  - i. Flight and travel arrival information
  - ii. Seneca will arrange for transportation from the airport to your residence or temporary accommodations at no cost based on your travel plan submitted through the **Seneca MOBILE App** available for [Apple](#) and [Android](#). You must submit your travel information at least 72 hours prior to arrival.
- b. It is recommended to provide your arrival information in the [ArriveCAN App](#)

## Welcome to Canada

Upon your arrival to Canada please make sure to carry the following with you:

- ☐ Face mask (recommended)
- ☐ Study Permit, or valid Letter of Introduction
- ☐ Passport with a valid student VISA or eTA (electronic Travel Authorization)
- ☐ Letter of Acceptance (LOA) and Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL)
- ☐ Proof that you have **enough money** to support yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada
- ☐ All mandatory and recommended apps on your phone (see [Section 04 – Pre-Departure document](#) for more information)
- ☐ You will not pick up your checked luggage until after you visit Canadian Border Services. Don't pack any mandatory documents or important information in your checked luggage

**NOTE:** Be sure to have any snacks, medication, toiletries and other necessary items in your carry on.

## Canadian Border Services

In the airport, you will proceed to Canadian Border Services. Present your **mandatory documents** detailed in Section 02 to the Canada Border Services Agent.

**NOTE:** We recommend you complete your mandatory documents and travel plan at least two weeks before you travel to Canada. Keep these documents with you in your carry-on luggage when you travel.

## At the Airport and to Your Residence or Accommodations
