### International Students Enrolling in the May 2026 Term

Your eligibility for a PGWP depends on your program of study, the date you submitted your study permit application or PGWP application and meeting the minimum language proficiency required by the government.

To be eligible for a PGWP, you must complete a degree program or another program that meets the [field of study requirements](#). You must also:

- Complete the duration of your program inside Canada, time spent studying outside Canada will be deducted from the length of your PGWP
- Complete at least 50% of your program in class
- "In class" includes: in-person, hybrid, and flexible delivery format
- For flexible delivery you must plan to attend on campus
- Meet the minimum language proficiency required by IRCC, which is a Canadian Language Benchmark 5 (CLB5) for graduates of certificate, diploma, advanced diplomas, or graduate certificates; and Canadian Language Benchmark 7 (CLB7) for graduates of degree programs
- Meet all other [PGWP requirements](#)

To ensure you are eligible for a PGWP, please review the [date of your study permit](#) application.

## Preparing for Class

### IMPORTANT TO-DO'S

To complete as soon as possible before your first day of class on May 4, 2026.

- Login to [Student Home](#) to [confirm your program choice](#).
- To reserve a seat in your program and to be eligible to enrol in classes and create a class schedule, you must pay a minimum \$2,000 first semester deposit by the due date in your fee notice. Once you have paid your tuition deposit you will receive a Letter of Acceptance (LOA) and [Provincial Attestation Letter](#) (PAL), if applicable, from Seneca.  
\*Students can receive up to a \$5,000 [Entrance Scholarship](#). The amount received is based on the number of years of study.
- Apply for your [study permit](#). Seneca has partnered with [BorderPass](#) to offer you free access to comprehensive immigration application support services for your Canadian study permit. This safe, nationally recognized service connects you with Canadian immigration lawyers who will review and submit your application ensuring it is complete and accurate.  
[Create your BorderPass account and get your application started now](#). During the application process and throughout your studies at Seneca, you will also have access to [personalized immigration support from Seneca's immigration specialist team](#).

#### Connect to a Peer for Pre-Arrival Support

- At Seneca we want you to have the best start possible. #### Enrolment opens

- If you have paid your tuition deposit, you can select your class schedule starting on April 9, 2026. Instructions can be found [online](#). When possible, select courses that have an in-class component (e.g. in-person, hybrid or flexible). If your courses are only available online, the time you spend studying in [Canada](#) will still count towards the length of your Post-Graduate Work Permit (PGWP) provided it accounts for no more than 50 per cent of your studies. 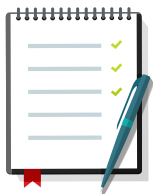
## Before You Travel

Before you travel to Canada as an international student, you must have:

- Study Permit, or valid Letter of Introduction
- Passport with a valid VISA or eTA (electronic Travel Authorization)
- Seneca LOA, and PAL
- Proof that you have [enough money](#) to support yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada

**NOTE:** You will not be allowed to enter or begin your studies in Canada without the necessary authorized documentation.

**NOTE:** Keep Seneca informed: [upload](#) a copy of your Letter of Introduction in Student Home.

#### Technology

#### Downloads

Please add these downloads to the mobile phone or tablet you will be using in Canada. You will need access to these apps prior to travelling to Canada and when you arrive in Canada.



- Seneca's App Suite**
  - Seneca has an app suite to help you stay up to date on the latest Seneca news and access resources including your class schedule, grades, fees and more through **SENECA MOBILE**. You can also submit your travel plan and schedule airport pickup.
  - For students with in-person learning activities on campus, **SENECA NAVIGATE** will help you find classrooms and washrooms easily thanks to detailed maps of Newnham and Seneca@York campuses.
  - SENECA SAFE** enables you to receive important safety alerts directly to your smartphone if an on-campus emergency occurs.
- ArriveCAN App**

The [ArriveCAN App](#) was created by the Canadian government to help you minimize wait times and delays upon arrival and to help you share your travel plan with customs and immigration.
- Seneca Virtual OneCard**

The [Virtual Seneca OneCard](#) is your student I.D. You will present it to access various campus facilities such as library resources or the inter campus shuttle. You can also use it to make purchases on-campus, manage your student account and more.
- The MORCARE Medical App**

Access to health care and dental services in Canada may be quite different from what you are used to at home. A summary of services can be found [online](#) and you can download/print your MORCARE Medical Card [at the Seneca International website](#).

**NOTE:** New students will not be able to access your medical card until after Day 10 of classes.

**NOTE:** Wi-Fi is available at the airport. If you do not have a Canadian SIM, you will still have access to online services.

## Book Your Seneca Transportation from the Airport

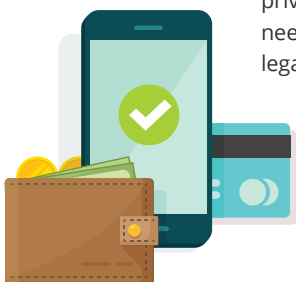
- Seneca provides complimentary [transportation](#) from the airport to your place of residence or accommodations by private taxi at no cost based on your travel plan submitted through the **Seneca MOBILE App** available for [Apple](#) and [Android](#). To confirm your pick up, your travel plan must be submitted at least 72 hours prior to arrival.

## Plan Your Finances

- Have a plan for how you will manage your finances, pay for groceries, rent, etc.
- Visit our [Finances in Canada](#) website for helpful information on banking, working in Canada, fraud awareness, and personal tax filings.
- Seneca campuses are cashless. For students coming on campus, you will be able to use your debit, credit or the Seneca OneCard for purchases and payments.
- You may be eligible to work on or off-campus if your study permit includes this privilege. Before starting work, you will need a [Social Insurance Number \(SIN\)](#) to legally work in Canada. [Apply online](#).

## Plan for Groceries, etc.

- Upon arrival, it is important to plan on how you will obtain groceries and essentials. Most grocery stores and pharmacies will deliver to your front door. Check online to find an option in your neighbourhood.

## Plan Your Travel
