Studying From Home

This checklist is for international students who:

- i) will be staying in their home country,
- ii) will be joining classes online (your courses must be available in online or flexible **delivery format** to study from home).
- iii) understand that time spent studying outside of Canada from September 1, 2024 is not counted toward PGWP.



International Students Enrolling in the May 2026 Term

Your eligibility for a PGWP depends on your program of study, the date you submitted your study permit application or PGWP application and meeting the minimum language proficiency required by the government.

To be eligible for a PGWP, you must complete a degree program or another program that meets the **field of study requirements**. You must also:

- Complete the duration of your program inside Canada, time spent studying outside Canada will be deducted from the length of your PGWP
- Complete at least 50% of your program in class
- "In class" includes: in-person, hybrid, and flexible delivery format
- For flexible delivery you must plan to attend on campus
- Meet the minimum language proficiency required by IRCC, which is a Canadian Language Benchmark 5 (CLB5) for graduates of certificate, diploma, advanced diplomas, or graduate certificates; and Canadian Language Benchmark 7 (CLB7) for graduates of degree programs
- Meet all other **PGWP requirements**

To ensure you are eligible for a PGWP, please review the **date of your study permit** application.

To complete as soon as possible before your first day of class on May 4, 2026

- Login to [Student Home](#) to [confirm your program choice](#).
- To reserve a seat in your program and to be eligible to enrol in classes and create a class schedule, you must pay a minimum \$2,000 first semester deposit by the due date in your fee notice. Once you have paid your tuition deposit you will receive a Letter of Acceptance (LOA) and [Provincial Attestation Letter \(PAL\)](#), if applicable, from Seneca. *Students can receive up to a \$5,000 [Entrance Scholarship](#). The amount received is based on the number of years of study.
- Apply for your [study permit](#). Seneca has partnered with [BorderPass](#) to offer you free access to comprehensive immigration application support services for your Canadian study permit. This safe, nationally recognized service connects you with Canadian immigration lawyers who will review and submit your application ensuring it is complete and accurate.
