Students and faculty from the [Business Management - Entrepreneurship & Innovation](#) graduate certificate program spent the first week of May 2023 in Neu-Ulm, Germany, as part of Seneca's involvement in an International Start-up League initiative.

More than 100 participants from 10 international institutions congregated to learn about different entrepreneurial topics in lectures and workshops. Students mixed with their international peers to apply newly-gained knowledge to work on real-life sustainability challenges set up by a local start-up company.
