As well, flags at Seneca, including an orange flag, will fly at half-mast to recognize the thousands of innocent Indigenous children who died at residential schools and missing and murdered Indigenous girls and women in Canada.

On Thursday, Sept. 21, starting at 11 a.m., we will launch the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and host the Seneca@York Courtyard Grand Opening.
