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When I first learned about the virtual exchange program with Neu-Ulm Hochschule, I was really excited. This new initiative proposed the option to undertake international studies without leaving Canada. Neu-Ulm is located in Bavaria, Germany. I found the classes at HNU to be similar to my courses at Seneca. The professors have a similar teaching style and the classes were delivered through Zoom. The one main difference I encountered was that in Germany there is no reading week, or midterm tests. The largest grading percentage of my courses came from my final exam. The final exam was given to us, international students, through email. We had to print it and solve it, and once we were done we had to send it back to our professors at HNU. Through this program I got to learn some

interesting topics related to finance and the way in which they are carried out in Europe.

I believe that these experiences help you grow and give you transferable skills, like time management and discipline. I believe that even though the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted and changed the way we learn, technology enables us to break barriers.
