Seneca Polytechnic was honoured to welcome Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and Premier Doug Ford to King Campus on Friday, Feb. 9.

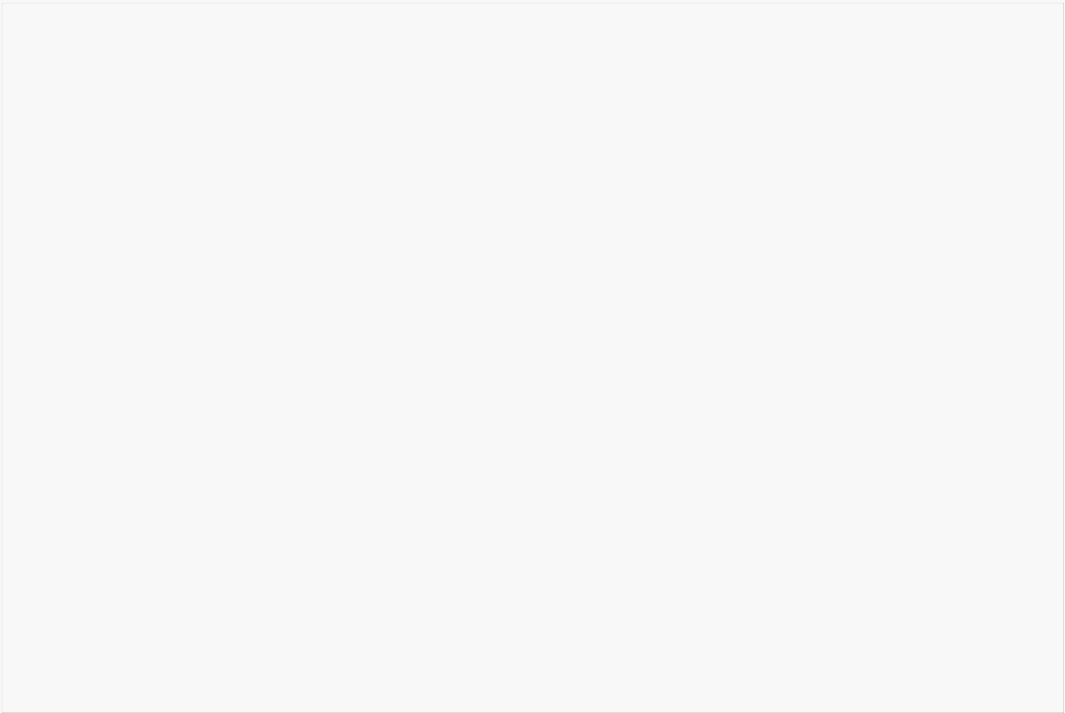

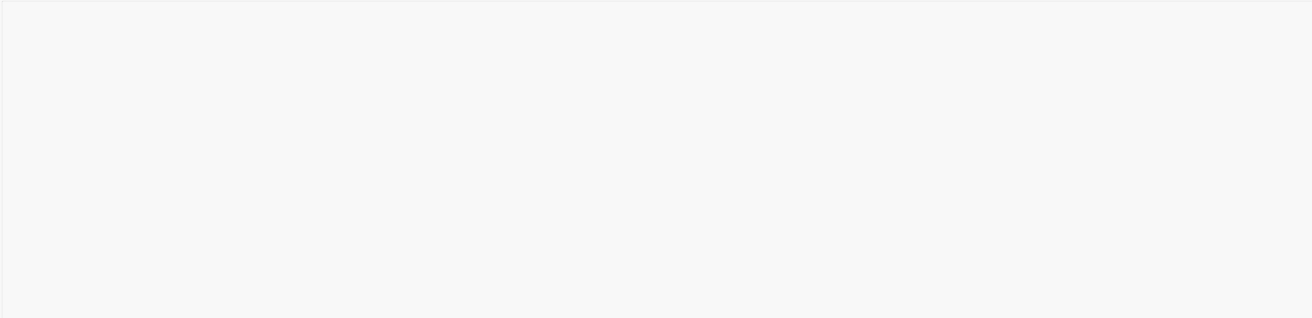
In addition to the announcement, the visiting dignitaries met students from the Seneca Nanji Foundation School of Nursing and saw some of their innovative learning spaces.

Our students did us proud, telling the Prime Minister and the Premier about our proud history of more than 50 years of delivering internationally-recognized nursing programs.

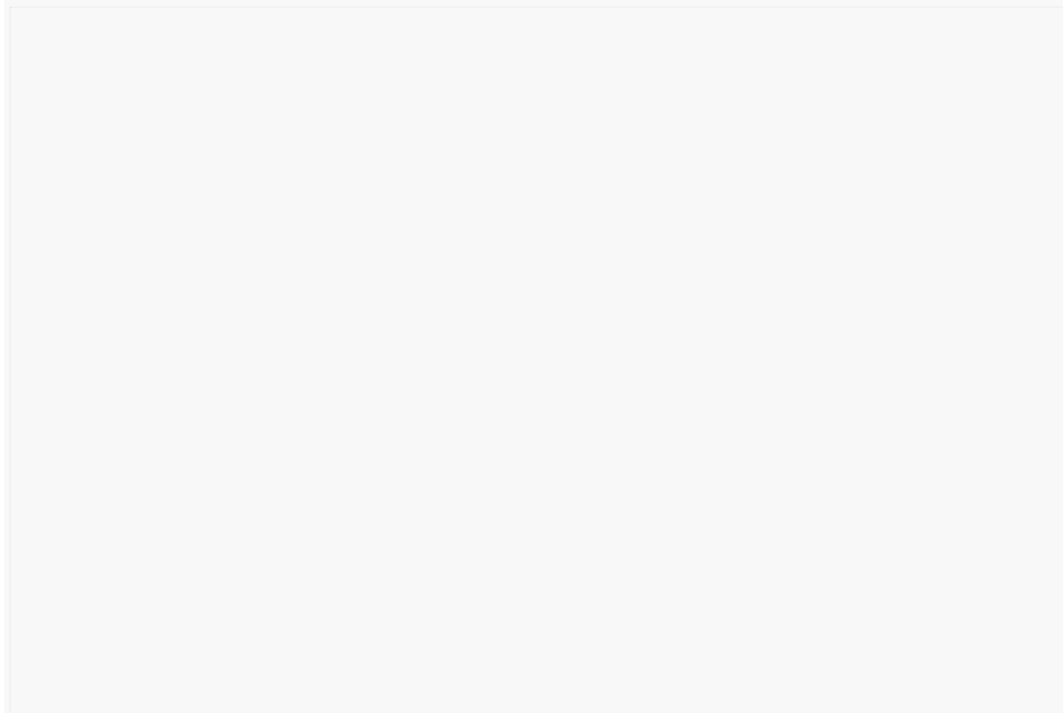

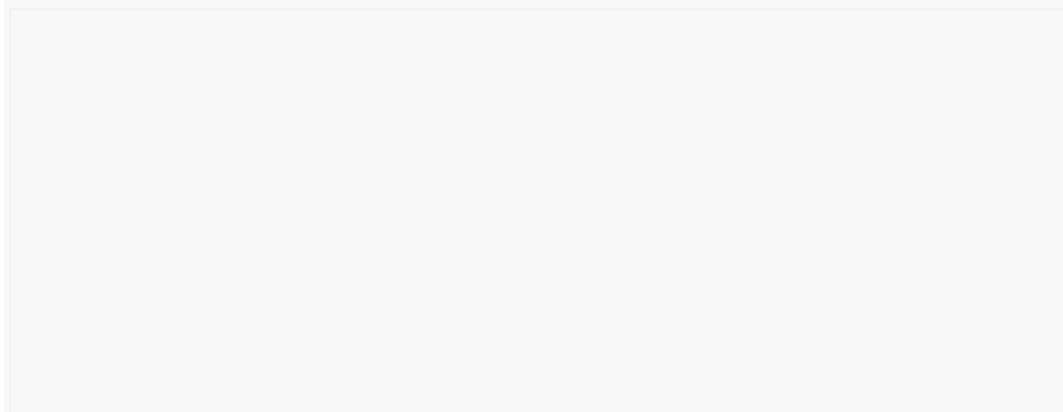


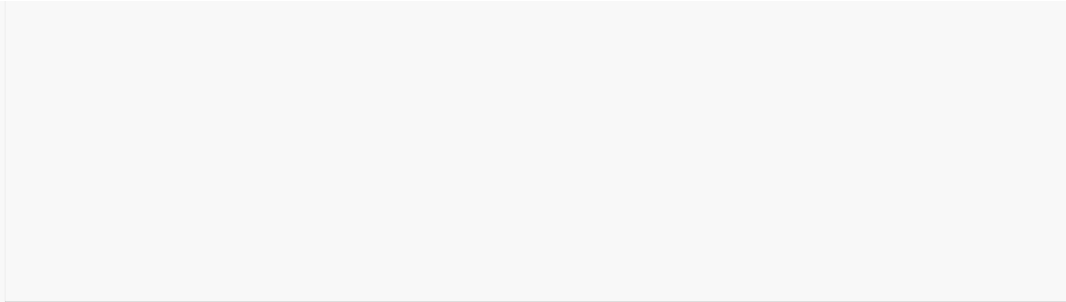
Prime Minister Justin Trudeau speaks in the Patient Care Simulation Lab (Photo credit: Adam Scotti / Prime Minister's Office)

Trudeau speaks to Ashif Somani, Board of Governors Chair





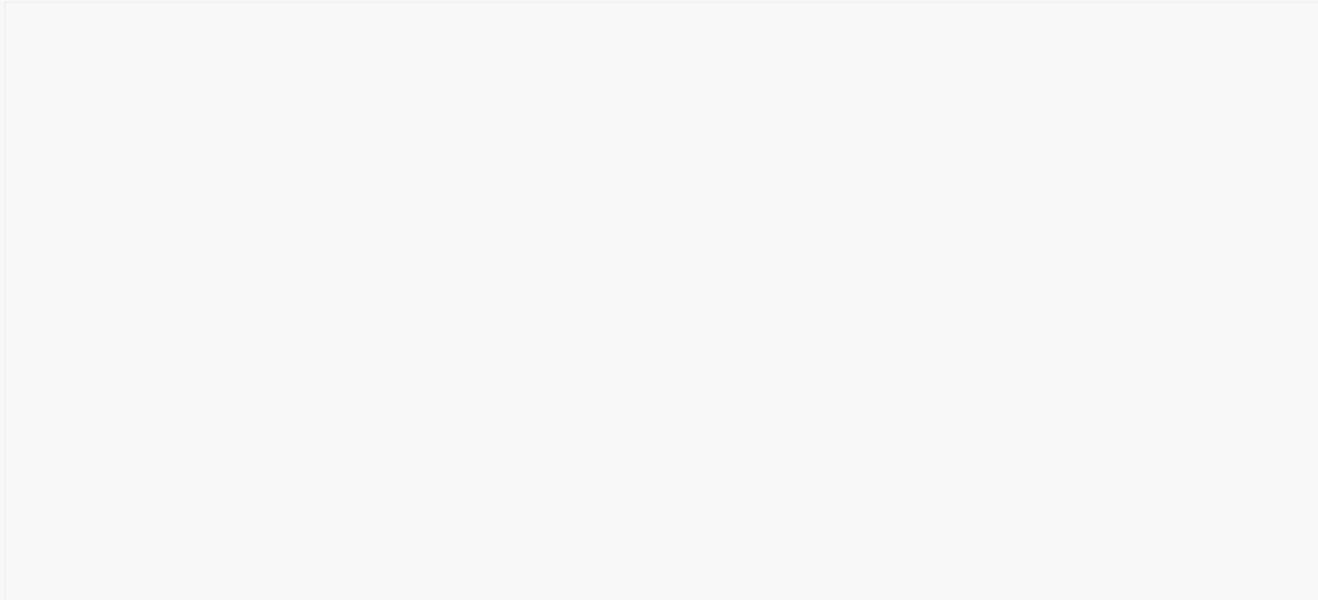
