Paper

- boxboard (e.g. cereal, tissue boxes)
- card and cover stock
- clean corrugated cardboard
- cup sleeves (paper/cardboard)
- envelopes and file folders
- fine paper
- flyers and catalogues
- newspaper and magazines

Please flatten cardboard and empty all containers before disposing.

Recycling

• aluminum and metal cans and containers





- clear and coloured glass bottles
- milk cartons and juice boxes
- plastic materials, including:
 - plastic bottles, jugs and jars
 - plastic containers
 - plastic hair care product bottles

Please empty all containers before disposing. Rinsing containers help to reduce odors and pests.

Organics

- food products, such as:
 - dairy and eggshells
 - fruits and vegetables
 - houseplants
 - meat and fish products (including bones)
 - other food items (e.g. candy)
 - pasta, bread, cereal and other grain products
 - soups
 - $\circ\,$ tea bags, coffee grounds and filters

Garbage

- aluminum foil and cling wrap
- beverage cups
- biodegradable and compostable containers
- black plastic
- cigarette butts
- condiment packages





ORGANICS



- corks
- disposable mop sheets
- dryer lint or sheets
- food packaging (e.g. chip bags, wrappers, etc.)
- grease proof containers (e.g. fry and burger containers, etc.)
- greasy, oily and food-stained boxes/wrappers
- gum
- masks, gloves and face shields
- padded envelopes
- plastic bags
- plastic utensils
- sanitary products (e.g. baby wipes, cotton balls, ear cleaners, makeup removal pads)
- styrofoam
- vacuum bags and contents
- wax paper
- waxed cardboard
