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## What is Work-Integrated Learning (WIL)?

Work-integrated learning (WIL) is an experiential learning opportunity for students to utilize the knowledge and skills learned in the classroom and apply it to the workplace. WIL opportunities are available for more than 80 programs across various industry sectors.

## Benefits of WIL

- Most positions are paid

- Minimum of four months in length (one semester) typically with full-time hours

## Difference between a co-op and work term

A co-op term is usually a full-time paid position that is completed between two academic semesters. A work term usually involves full-time hours and can either be between two academic semesters or at the end of a program. Depending on the program you choose, Seneca offers either a co-op or a work term, which can be mandatory or optional. ## Eligibility Requirements for WIL

## WIL Work Term Preparation (WTP) Course

Students in WIL are enrolled in a work term prep course (WTP100 or WTP200) designed to prepare them for their WIL experience. Seneca Works encourages students to start preparing for their job search before their WTP course. Seneca Works helps students in planning their careers and preparing for work. This includes support in career exploration, developing a career action plan, preparing job search documents, connecting with potential employers, preparing for interviews and looking for jobs.

## WIL Fees

There is a \$495 non-refundable fee for domestic and international students to participate in WIL.

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
