Workshop Options:

Workshop title	Description
Communication & Emotional Intelligence for Today's Leaders	Strong leadership starts with effective communication. This workshop explores essential communication skills, including how to navigate workplace disagreements. Students will

	also build emotional intelligence through self-awareness, self-regulation and social awareness, and learn how to apply these skills on the job.
Identifying Your Leadership Skills	You've gained more leadership skills than you think. In this interactive session, students will identify strengths developed through coursework, clubs and community involvement, and uncover transferable skills they can apply in future roles.
Your AI Job Search Toolkit: Five Useful Prompts	AI is changing the job search. This session explores how to use AI to identify career paths, tailor resumes and cover letters, and prepare for interviews. Students will learn practical prompts they can use right away.
Entrepreneurship	Discover what it takes to be an intrapreneur or entrepreneur. This session introduces venture pathways, steps to get started and an overview of HELIX – Seneca's innovation and entrepreneurship incubator.
