

How to start a Global Learning Opportunity

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Seneca's Global Learning Opportunities allow you to gain valuable personal and professional skills. You will also gain course credits!



Step 1: Find a Global Learning Opportunity

We have many opportunities across our Seneca programs. Determine what you want from an experience. Consider length, together with other Seneca students, and cost.

Step 2: Review the Global Opportunity Page

Each Global Learning Opportunity has a dedicated page with important information. Critical details are at the top of the page. Additional information and links to important websites are also included. You can also find the [Credit Transfer Guide here](#). This is important for completing the [Outbound Student Learning Agreement](#).



Step 3: Contact Global Learning and Engagement

We strongly recommend attending an [information session](#) and/or booking a [1-on-1 advising appointment](#) with our team. This is a chance to narrow your options, clarify details and learn important information.



Step 4: Meet with your Academic Program Area

Your Academic Program Area is a huge support as you plan your Global Learning Opportunity. Talk to them about: (1) where you are in your Seneca program, (2) how the Global Learning Opportunity fits with your academic program and (3) completing and signing your learning agreement

A [signed Outbound Student Learning Agreement](#) is required for your application. Both you and the Academic Program Area (Student Advisor, Program Co-ordinator, or Academic Program Manager) must sign the document.



Step 5: Apply

No matter the Global Learning Opportunity, we have ONE application.

Start your [Outbound Student Mobility Application](#) via MoveON (Sign in with your Seneca credentials)

Complete applications include two major items: (1) Signed Learning Agreement and a (2) Personal Statement. Additional instructions/details are in the online application.



Step 6: Submit

Submit your complete application by the deadlines below.

Semester Exchange (for fall)	March 15
Semester Exchange (for winter)	April 30
Faculty-Led Program Abroad	Determined by departure date of program
Summer Academic Program	March 15
International Work Experience	Determined by your Academic Program Area

You will receive an update 3-4 weeks after the application deadline. If you're accepted, you'll also receive information on how much funding you'll receive.
