## Prepare to Study at Seneca

## Apply for your study permit

Anyone who is planning to study in Canada for longer than six months is required to have a study permit. After you have paid your tuition fees, you must apply for a Canadian study permit. If your program includes co-op/work placement, you should apply for a co-op work permit together with your study permit application. Refer to our [Guide](#) for support.

You are advised to plan ahead to apply for your study permit as the processing time varies for each country. Visit the [Citizenship and Immigration Canada website](#) to apply for your Study Permit.

## Book your Skills Assessment

As a new student at Seneca, you may be required to write the Skills Assessment, even if you have already written a pre-admissions test. The Skills Assessment is a tool to determine your academic placement in mathematics. We use the results of this assessment to prepare your

timetable. Students accepted into a graduate certificate program do not need to complete this assessment. While there is no assessment fee, if you do not write the assessment on time, you may be charged a \$30 late fee. ## Check if you are eligible for Transfer Credit

Transfer Credits are granted for courses taken at another accredited postsecondary institution which are deemed as equivalent to a course at Seneca. If you have a college or university level course that's similar to a Seneca course, you may be eligible to apply for Transfer Credit at Seneca.
