Textbooks and Supplies

- Purchase required textbooks, supplies and uniform before classes start. See the PND Homepage link for required resources. Books may be ordered online and via the Seneca bookstore prior to class start-up.

Seneca OneCard

- Request your Seneca Virtual (picture ID): Be sure to have a professional appearance because this is the picture ID that will be worn on your uniform. Inform the OneCard office that you need a clip-on version of the ID card to wear to agency placements.

- Attend Seneca Orientation: Prepare for the first weeks of class and gather information from other college departments that will help you through your first year at Seneca. You will receive further information on the specific date and time during the first week of classes.

First day of classes

Monday January 10, 2022

- Classes will be delivered online for semester one with the following *exceptions*. **Note that the on campus classes for Winter 2022 listed below are held at King Campus for**

both King and Yorkgate students:

- **PNL110:** All students will attend the lab portion of PNL100 in person at **King campus**.
- **MDM101:** All students will attend this class in person at **King campus**.
- **PNA100:** Students may choose either fully online or flexible for PNA100 (Anatomy and Physiology). Students who register for flexible may attend in-person on campus or live-stream the class from home.

Clinical Preparedness Permit

- A Clinical Preparedness Permit (CPP) ensure that students have met requirements for clinical practice prior to entering their clinical placements. The CPP includes medical and non-medical components and certification requirements, including COVID 19 vaccination. These are mandatory requirements for all clinical courses in the program. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all necessary requirements have been met. Students may not attend clinical practice without completion of the CPP.
