The Ontario First Generation Bursary

Award Number: 100507

Deadline: February 15

The Ontario First Generation Bursary (OFGB) supports financially needy Ontario students whose parents never attended postsecondary education, provided they study at a public college or university in Ontario.

You may be eligible for this bursary if meet the following requirements:

- You're attending a publicly-assisted college or university in Ontario
- You're in an approved postsecondary academic program (e.g. degree and diploma programs) or training program (e.g. apprenticeships).
- You meet citizenship and Ontario residency requirements as outlined on the OSAP

Application for Full-Time Students.

- You have demonstrated financial need based on the criteria as set out by your school.

Indigenous Student Bursary

Award Number: 200043

Deadline: February 15

The Indigenous Student Bursary provides aid to Indigenous students with financial need who are attending either:

- a publicly-assisted colleges and universities in Ontario
- an approved Aboriginal institute in Ontario

You may be eligible for this bursary if meet the following requirements:

- You're attending a publicly-assisted college or university in Ontario or an approved Aboriginal institute in Ontario.
- You're in an approved postsecondary academic program (e.g. degree and diploma programs) or training program (e.g. apprenticeships).
- You self-identify as being an Indigenous person in Canada (see definition, below).
- You meet citizenship and Ontario residency requirements as outlined on the OSAP Application for Full-Time Students.
- You have demonstrated financial need based on the criteria as set out by your school.

Ontario-Ukraine Solidarity Scholarship

Value: \$10,000

Deadline: February 15, 2026

In response to the Russian military invasion of Ukraine, on April 6, 2022, the provincial government announced the creation of a \$1.9 million Ontario-Ukraine Solidarity Scholarship to support students attending Ontario's publicly assisted colleges and universities. The purpose of these funds is to provide support to students directly or indirectly impacted by the Ukrainian conflict or students impacted by other conflicts.

Cathy James Memorial Award

This award was established in honour and memory of former faculty member Cathy James. Awarded to graduating students in the Liberal Arts University Transfer program or the Arts and Science - University Transfer program who are pursuing undergraduate studies with Seneca's university partners and demonstrate financial need. In addition, the recipient will have outstanding academic performance, demonstrated compassion and integrity, proven collegiality and sincerity, academic curiosity and intellectual passion. Eligible students must be Canadian citizens, permanent residents or protected persons and Ontario residents. The recipients will be recommended by faculty.

Awarded to a graduating student in the Liberal Arts University Transfer program or the Arts and Science - University Transfer program who is pursuing undergraduate studies with the Seneca's university partners. In addition, the recipient will have outstanding academic performance, demonstrated compassion and integrity, proven collegiality and sincerity, academic curiosity and intellectual passion. The recipient will be recommended by faculty.

CRAC Dr. Heslegrave Clinical Research Ethics Award

Deadline: February 15

Awarded to a full-time student in the Clinical Research program who excels at or demonstrates strong interest in clinical research ethics. The recipient will have a GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need. Preference is given to a student who is invested in clinical research and engaged with the program. The recipient will be recommended by faculty. The recipient will be presented at a Clinical Research Association of Canada (CRAC) event in the spring and also receive a one-year membership. This award honours Dr. Heslegrave, a leading researcher and contributor to the field of research ethics for 25 years. He is remembered for his intense passion for the ethical conduct of research.

Ermine Drummond Second Chance Endowed Bursary

Deadline: February 15

Awarded to a student enrolled in the College Opportunities Program. Preference is given to a student who has good academic performance, demonstrated commitment to working to overcome obstacles in pursuit of their career/educational goals, good work ethic and attitude. Eligible students must be Canadian citizens, permanent residents or protected persons and Ontario residents, have demonstrated financial need and completed at least one semester of study. Selection will be made on faculty members' recommendation. Additional consideration will be given to applicants who volunteer in the college or in the community, verified by a letter of reference.

Ji Hun Memorial Award*

Deadline: February 15

Awarded to a full-time English Language Institute (ELI) student in good academic standing who shows leadership, embraces diversity and demonstrates active engagement on campus and in the wider community. The recipient is an international student that has completed level 8 and is now in a full-time program at Seneca. The recipient will be recommended by an ELI Committee and faculty. This award is established in memory of Ji Hun Kim, a Korean ELI student who was a model student and actively engaged in her studies and the community beyond the classroom. She is remembered as a force of positivity and intellectual curiosity.

John Kinrade Memorial/SSF Scholarship

In recognition of Dr. Kinrade's commitment to lifelong learning, this award is given to a full time student entering the final year of the Chemical Engineering Technology program who has shown outstanding aptitude for course content and a passion for learning, as demonstrated with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 and involvement in the program. The recommendation is made by faculty members.

Learning & Leadership Laureate*

Awarded to a graduating student in the LAT program who maintains a GPA of 3.0 and is intending to enroll in a degree program. They have shown growth in their learning, mindset and resilience by demonstrating leadership and collaboration in the classroom environment and have consistently upheld academic integrity.

Malca Litovitz Prize for Creative Writing Bursary

Award for creative writing to be given to a Seneca student who most demonstrates Malca's qualities of creativity and commitment to writing. Eligible students must be Canadian citizens, permanent residents or protected persons and Ontario residents with demonstrated financial need.

Peter Gilgan Fdn Access to Technology Bursary *

Available to students in the Pathways to Postsecondary, Academic Upgrading programs who have a tech need such as a laptop or computer. Recipients demonstrate financial need.

Peter Gilgan Foundation Award *

Awarded to students in the Pathways to Postsecondary, Academic Upgrading programs based on academic performance and demonstrated financial need.

Society of Cosmetic Chemists Degree Award

Award Number: 200505

Deadline: February 15

Awarded to a third-year student in the full-time Bachelor of Science – Cosmetic Science degree program. The recipient must demonstrate creativity as well as collaboration and teamwork in the lab and have a high GPA. With the previous criteria being equal, financial need will be the determining factor. The Society of Cosmetic Chemists will offer the award recipients additional engagement opportunities, such as writing an article for their newsletter, making a presentation at a chapter meeting and complimentary attendance to chapter events.

Walker Wood Foundation Child Mental Health Award

Deadline: February 15

Awarded to full-time domestic students in the Infant and Early Child Mental Health program. The recipients demonstrate high academic achievement (min GPA of 3.5), involvement with community or extra-curricular activities, and financial need.
